### **Personal Information Collection Statement**

The data will also be used by the Society for communication purposes and in carrying out its functions pursuant to its Memorandum and Articles of Association and for the compilation of The Law List which is published for the purpose of facilitating the public and members of the Society in identifying and locating solicitors, foreign lawyers and law firms registered with the Society and in knowing the services they provide.

It is obligatory for you to supply the data requested in this form. The consequence for you if you fail to supply the data is that the Society will not be able to process your application for a practising certificate.
