



Riding the Wind: Regulating the New Capital Markets 14 April 2015 (Tuesday)

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The Global Financial Crisis (GFC) has been one of those defining moments, after which nothing seems the same. The trajectory of financial markets and their regulation has been knocked off its course; future directions remain uncertain.

Looking back at the development of modern capital markets and their regulation through the prism of crisis, there are surprises, as well as a multitude of unanswered questions. Regulation is a double edged sword. In some cases regulatory inaction is surprisingly effective although during the GFC, the depth and breadth of unregulated markets came as a rude shock.

Drawing on the insights provided by her new book, *International Capital Markets: Law and Institutions* (Oxford University Press, 2014), Professor Jordan looks at some of the more surprising aspects of modern capital markets and what the future may hold in terms of their development and regulation.

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About the Presenter

Professor Cally Jordan has both civil and common law degrees from McGill University and a DEA from the Université de Paris I (Panthéon-Sorbonne). She also holds an MA from the University of Toronto.

Between 1995 and 1997, Professor Jordan was an advisor to the Financial Services Bureau in Hong Kong and author of the proposals for reform of the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance (May 1997).

Admitted to practice in Ontario, Quebec, New York, California and Hong Kong, she spent several years with Cleary Gottlieb Steen & Hamilton in New York City. She has also advised international financial institutions, such as The World Bank, in Indonesia, Vietnam, the Philippines, Tunisia, China, Chile, Korea, Slovakia, Armenia, Macedonia, Lithuania, Egypt, Kenya, Uganda, Tanzania, Bahrain, Mauritius and Cambodia.

She now teaches International Capital Markets, Corporations, International Corporate Governance and Comparative Law at Melbourne Law School. She has also taught at McGill, Osgoode Hall, Duke, Georgetown, Tulane, Florida, CTLS (London) and IUC (Torino). Recently, she has been a visitor at the Max Planck Institute (Hamburg), the London School of Economics, the British Institute for International and Comparative Law and Georgetown Law Centre. In 2013, she was the P.R.I.M.E. Finance Fellow at the Netherlands Institute for Advanced Study.

A member of both the American and European Law Institutes, she also serves on the Local Capital Markets Advisory Council of the EBRD, London.

Her latest book, *International Capital Markets: Law and Institutions*, Oxford University Press, appeared in July 2014.

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
