

10:30am | Panel 1 - Blockchain and cryptocurrency disputes in International Arbitration

Disputes involving blockchain technology and assets in the form of cryptocurrency have become more common in international arbitration. This panel will explore the formation of such novel disputes, and consider the issue of jurisdiction of an arbitral tribunal in the presence and absence of express arbitration clauses in the underlying contract to a cryptocurrency transaction. The panel will further consider the concept of 'property' in the context of cryptocurrencies, recent jurisprudence, interim measures applications (types and challenges etc.) and discuss potential issues for enforcement of arbitral awards stemming from cryptocurrency arbitration.
