Mandatory Use of the iCMS

The Judiciary has been developing the integrated Court Case Management System ("iCMS") to handle court-related documents and payments electronically across various court levels. It is the Judiciary's aim that all represented litigants will be required to conduct their litigations electronically, unless otherwise exempted in particular circumstances. A consultation paper issued by the Judiciary in January 2024 sets out a proposed time-table that the Judiciary plans to mandate the use of the iCMS by legal representatives.

The switch to electronic transaction of business with the Court requires careful consideration and planning, including resources re-allocation and training (for instance, the demonstration-cumbriefings which the Judiciary put out and has repeated a number of times last year). The process takes time. I would urge members who have not yet started to prepare themselves for the mandatory regime to give thoughts to the requisite preparation work. Information on the iCMS including Users Registration could be found from a dedicated webpage on the Judiciary's website.

New Fixed Costs in Matrimonial Causes

Fixed costs are available for matrimonial causes under the District Court (Fixed Costs in Matrimonial Causes) Rules, Cap. 336F. Private practitioners can choose whether to elect fixed costs for a matrimonial matter, irrespective of whether that matter is or is not a legal aid assignment, and if the matter is a legal aid assignment, practitioners will routinely be asked to elect fixed costs.

These fixed costs have not been adjusted for over 20 years and we have asked the Government for a review. Having regard to economic changes and other developments in the past, and after various discussions with the Government, a new set of fixed costs in matrimonial causes was agreed and has become effective on 1 March 2024.
